Orders will be filled in the order that I receive them and I will let you know if I run out of something. I hope to continue doing drop-offs every other week and will send out updated information on product availability each time. ## Duck Eggs & Honey

	Quantity	Notes
Duck eggs – Half dozen (\$4)		I have plenty and the eggs should be good through early to mid-May if you want to stock up. Most of the eggs are currently weighing approximately 3 oz, but I'm starting to get a few giant eggs that weigh over 3.5 oz.
Duck eggs – Dozen (\$7)		
Honey – 13 oz glass jar (\$10)		I only have approximately half a dozen jars left from the 2019 harvest. I am currently anticipating that the 2020 harvest will occur in late June or early July.

## Native Plants

- The link below each plant name will take you to the plant's description on my website. Information provided in the description include height, bloom time, moisture and sun requirements, what types of pollinators and wildlife use the plant, and a picture of the flower.
- Small plants are in containers that are approximately 5" tall x 3.5" wide, medium plants are in containers that are approximately 6.25" tall x 6.5" wide, and large plants are in containers that are approximately 7.5" tall x 6.5" wide.
- Overwintered plants have been outside all winter and should be able to go in the ground whenever you want to plant them. Some of the new seedlings may still need a little protection on our colder nights.
